1. Decentralization of decision making:  
Indicators
  - a. local planning decisions—local/non-local
  - b. decision making re: local budget—local/non-local
  - c. selection of local senior administrative officer—local/non-local
  
2. Popular (democratic) participation in local consultation and decision making  
Indicators
  - a. planning decisions—open consultation/no-consultation
  - b. decision making re: local budget—open consultation/no consultation
  - c. determination of local senior administrative officer—elected/appointed
  
3. Inclusion of citizens in public management (organizational process) and service delivery  
Indicators
  - a. public participation in service design (garbage collection?)—participation/no participation
  - b. means for feedback to service design—feedback/no feedback
  
4. Reinforcing accountability and system credibility  
Indicators
  - a. local budget information—open closed
  - b. public record of administrative decision making—record/no record
  - c. formal procedure for enabling public feedback to administrative decision-making-procedure/no procedure
  
5. Increased government transparency and the of reduction of corruption:  
Indicators
  - a. Visible scheduling of public services—visible/invisible
  - b. Visible queues for public services—visible/invisible
