2008 Theme: Citizen Engagement and Service Delivery

Background

The CAPAM International Innovations Awards Programme invites submissions that demonstrate excellence, innovation and quality service delivery in public administration. The programme is open to CAPAM Members only, and is adjudicated by an esteemed group of public sector leaders representing all the regions of the Commonwealth. Applicants are invited to submit a 1,500 word description of a significant innovation or policy in public administration and management that meets the theme of the 2008 Awards Programme. Those selected as finalists will have the opportunity to present their submission to the delegates at the 2008 CAPAM Biennial Conference in Barbados.

Theme

The theme of the 2008 Awards Programme is "Citizen Engagement and Service Delivery." The theme has been selected to elicit examples of innovative practices in providing public services that respond to expressed needs and wishes of citizens, and enable enhanced public participation in decisions surrounding service delivery.

Submissions

Each submission to the International Innovations Awards Programme must include:

- 1) A completed application form with all pertinent information listed.
- 2) A 50-word executive summary of the submission
- 3) A 1500-word description of the project
- 4) The US\$75 entry fee.
